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# ABOUT PASSAIC COUNTY



Passaic County borders New York State on the north and is surrounded on the other sides by Sussex, Morris, Essex, and Bergen counties in New Jersey. Passaic County has 186.1 square miles, making it the 18th in size among New Jersey's counties. On the basis of population, it ranks as the 9th most populous county in New Jersey. The 2020 Decennial Census by the United States Census Bureau estimated the population of Passaic County to be 524,118.

Passaic County is shaped like a bent hourglass, with the area above the neck running generally north and south, and the portion below running east to west. The upper half of Passaic County is characterized by large lakes and watershed areas with low density development. The lower half of Passaic County contains more than 85% of the population in a third of the area.

Passaic County is made up of 16 municipalities. West Milford Township, at the northern tip of Passaic County, is the largest in size with 78.30 square miles of land. The Borough of Prospect Park is the smallest, with .45 square miles of land.

The highest point in Passaic County is Bearfort Mountain in West Milford with an elevation of 1,484 feet. Passaic County's lowest spots are tidal lands along the Passaic River in Passaic and Clifton. Passaic County has over 40 lakes and ponds with areas in excess of 20 acres, as well as nine reservoirs.

Passaic County offers something for everyone including a collection of historic sites, abundant natural beauty, diverse cultural profiles, outdoor recreational opportunities, scenic landscapes, manicured parks and walkways, preserved farmlands, fine dining options, bustling downtown areas, and year-round programming for residents and visitors alike.

County government serves as the middle layer of government between federal and state governments and local municipalities. New Jersey has 21 counties, and no two counties are exactly the same. Each county's demographic, geographic, and economic characteristics dictate how they deliver services to their communities. The organization and structure of counties are tailored to fit their communities' needs and characteristics.

In Passaic County's commission form of government, the County Commissioners discharge the legislative and executive responsibilities of government. The seven-member board is headed by a director who is selected to serve a one-year term at the Board's annual reorganizational meeting, held in January. Each County Commissioner is elected at-large for a staggered three-year term.

The Passaic County Commissioners are responsible for an annual budget of approximately \$467 million serving nearly 525,000 residents in 16 municipalities.

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# ROLE OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

The Passaic County Commissioners support and are responsible for:

- Maintenance of 533 miles of County roads and 358 bridges.
- 14 County Parks with over 16,000 acres of parkland.
- The Passaic County Sheriff's Office, with the responsibility of public safety, courthouse security, and crime prevention.
- The Passaic County Prosecutor's Office, with the responsibility to investigate and prosecute all crimes that take place within its jurisdiction while promoting the security of its residents and respecting the rights afforded to all crime victims.
- Preakness Healthcare Center, a 406-bed skilled nursing facility providing sub-acute care, physical rehabilitation, long-term care, behavioral management, ventilator/respiratory care, hospice and palliative care, and respite services.
- Passaic County Community College, serving nearly 10,000 students in both traditional and online programs.
- Passaic County Technical-Vocational Schools, a high school serving over 4,500 students.
- Social Service Programs for the elderly, the disadvantaged, and people with disabilities.
- Preakness Valley Golf Course, a 36-hole public state-of-the-art golf facility.
- Other services provided to County residents, such as mental health and addiction services, veterans' programs, heating assistance, and more.

COUNTY COMMISSIONER PAT LEPORE was first elected to the Board of County Commissioners in 2004. His past service includes four terms as the Mayor of Woodland Park and a term on the Borough Council. He and his wife, Linda, are proud to call Woodland Park home. They live there along with their son Robert, his wife Rebecca, and two grandchildren. Robert is a veteran of United States Marine Corps and continues his service to his community and country as a police officer in Woodland Park. As Director Lepore very proudly commented at his swearing-in ceremony: "My son's public service far exceeds my own."

Upon election to the Board, he retired as a Sales Representative for the Entenmann's Division of George Weston Bakeries. He remains a member of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (IBT) Union Local 802 located in Long Island City, NY. His commitment to Passaic County has been recognized by many public, private, and civic organizations. This includes service on the Alfred H. COUNTY COMMISSIONER JOHN W. BARTLETT was first elected to Passaic County's governing body in 2012. In his years as a County Commissioner, he has been a driving force behind many of the County's major public outreach initiatives, including the Complete Count Committee for Census 2020, Impact Passaic's Emergency Rental Assistance Program protecting vulnerable residents during and after the COVID-19 emergency, and recurring programs for families affected by autism -spectrum disorders and other disabilities. He has served on all of the Board's standing committees, and as Director of the Board in 2019 and 2024.

As Passaic County's representative on the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), and the NJTPA Board chairman in 2022-2023, Commissioner Bartlett helps prioritize and oversee \$3+ billion in annual infrastructure improvements in our region. Since he joined NJTPA, more than \$600 million in federal infrastructure funding has flowed into Passaic County, supporting projects from major road improvements on Routes 46, 3, 23, and 80; to completion of the county's section of the Morris Canal Greenway historic site; to major new investments in transit-oriented development; to safety improvements protecting vehicles, bicyclists, and pedestrians.

From 2013-2016 and 2022-2024, Commissioner Bartlett served on the Passaic County Board of Social Services. At his initiative, PCBSS launched an effort to make Social Services more accessible to immigrant communities by publishing information for the first time in Arabic, Bengali, and Spanish, as well as English. From 2009 to 2013, he served as the founding Chairman of Friends Of Passaic County Parks. Under his leadership, the foundation launched a summer concert series, revived the Passaic County Fair as a marquee annual event, and created opportunities for local residents to sponsor memorial benches, trees, and other commemorations for lost loved ones.

Educated at Harvard Law School, he is a Partner in Murphy Orlando LLC. He has been recognized with the highest professional peer-review rating for attorneys, AV-Preeminent, from Martindale-Hubbell, and as one of the New Jersey Law Journal's "Forty Under 40" promising young attorneys in 2010. Before law school, Commissioner Bartlett received a B.A. degree with honors from Brown University and was a Raoul Wallenberg Scholar at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He wrote for The Associated Press in Israel, and served as communications director for the national anti-crime organization Fight Crime: Invest in Kids in Washington, D.C. He lives in Wayne with his wife Dr. Khyati Y. Joshi and their son.

Roadway maintenance includes pavement between the curblines, drainage systems, street cleanings, and snow and ice control. Most civil cases heard in the Superior Court involve disputes in which a plaintiff claims that they have been hurt by the actions of the defendant and seeks monetary compensation. 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### APSHAWA PRESERVE

4 Northwood Drive, West Milford, NJ 07480

Apshawa Preserve is an untouched 594 -acre park featuring the Butler Reservoir and miles of hiking trails for beginners and experts alike. Hiking trails can be found via Google Maps and on-site kiosks. The preserve offers a diversity of habitats and stunning vistas attracting nature enthusiasts, birdwatchers, and photographers.



#### **CAMP HOPE**

1792 Union Valley Road, West Milford, NJ 07480



Camp Hope, a beautiful 62-acre wooded retreat located on the shores of Greenwood Lake, buzzes year-round with activity. This park features hiking trails, bocce and pickleball courts, cabins, a softball field, a swimming pool and spray park, and more. Each year, the camp entertains children and

senior citizens from throughout the county. On Tuesdays in September through June, Camp Hope is open to all from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. for breakfast, lunch, and bingo.

### **DUNDEE ISLAND PARK**

Veterans Court, Passaic, NJ 07055

Dundee Island Park features a soccer field, playground, spray park, fitness and exercise equipment, elevated field house with a concession and restroom facilities, a community garden, boat launch, river walk, and an amphitheater. Opened in 2020, it is



the newest park in the Passaic County Park System. This is the first step in a long-term plan to develop a riverfront park along the Passaic River.

### **GARRET MOUNTAIN RESERVATION**

8 Mountain Avenue, Woodland Park, NJ 07424

This 310-acre park designed by the Olmsted Brothers Firm offers open grass areas, basketball courts, a lake for fishing, and an equestrian center. The park also features a new playground, picnic areas, a boat house, and trails for both hikers and bikers. Situated more than 500 feet above



sea level, the reservation offers views from Passaic County to the Manhattan skyline.

### GOFFLE BROOK PARK

675 Goffle Road, Hawthorne, NJ 07506



This scenic 103-acre park in Hawthorne, designed by the famed Olmsted Brothers Firm, features include picnic areas, athletic fields, a dog park, playground equipment, and a duck pond. Goffle Brook Park is especially frequented

in the winter, offering the ideal landscape for snow-day sledding. The park is also home to the Passaic County Arts Center at the John W. Rea House.

## HIGHLANDS PRESERVE

Hewitt (West Milford), NJ 07421

Highlands Preserve is a 224-acre park adjacent to the Abram S. Hewitt State Forest. The park contains scenic hiking trails, multipurpose athletic fields, and playground equipment. Highlands Preserve is one of the premier hiking destinations in New Jersey,



with trails that connect with the adjacent State Forest near the edge of Greenwood Lake, the Quail State Line and the Appalachian Trail.

### MAYOR DUNLEAVY MEMORIAL PARK

50 Glenwild Avenue, Bloomingdale, NJ 07403

This park is an approximately 44-acre natural woodland setting in Bloomingdale, circled by a looping trail and preserved wetlands. This park features a dog park and a 1-mile trail is perfect for beginners or those looking for a low-intensity hike.



## **MORRIS CANAL GREENWAY**

Clifton, Little Falls, Paterson, Pompton Lakes, Wayne, Woodland Park



The Morris Canal Greenway encompasses six Passaic County municipalities, featuring walking trails, interpretive signage and picnic areas. The Morris Canal was built from 1825 to 1831 to transport Pennsylvania coal to markets in New Jersey and New York, and

stretches 102 miles across six counties: Warren, Sussex, Morris, Passaic, Essex, and Hudson. The canal is a significant historic feature and is listed on the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places. Today, the Morris Canal Greenway project, a statewide partnership among local communities, nonprofit organizations, and historical societies, works to preserve and interpret the historic remains of the canal and create opportunities for passive public recreation.

## PECKMAN PRESERVE

Wilmore Road, Little Falls, NJ 07424

Peckman Preserve is a 12-acre preserve in Little Falls, adjacent to the filled bed of the Morris Canal. The natural landscape is made up of open space areas, meadows, wetlands, and plenty of wildlife which inhabit the land. Visitors walk the paths along the estuary.



#### POMPTON AQUATIC PARK

Woodlawn Ave, Pompton Lakes, NJ 07442

Pompton Aquatic Park is a riverside wildlife sanctuary located in Pompton Lakes, Wayne, and Pequannock. This park is nestled near the Pompton River and Morris Canal Greenway. Popular activities in the park include birdwatching, fishing, and hiking.



### PREAKNESS VALLEY PARK

209 Totowa Road, Wayne, NJ 07470



Preakness Valley Park is a 377-acre space on the border of Wayne and Totowa. The park contains the Preakness Valley Golf Course, a public 36-hole, full-service golf course with a clubhouse, practice facilities, caddy house, and maintenance facilities. Memberships are available to both Passaic

County residents and non-residents. The Dey Mansion Washington's Headquarters, a historic house museum which served as General George Washington's headquarters during 1780, is also located within the park.

### RIFLE CAMP PARK

387 Rifle Camp Road, Woodland Park, NJ 07424

Adjacent to Garret Mountain Reservation, the 169-acre Rifle Camp Park offers hiking, bird watching and other forms of passive and active recreation. The park also features an amphitheater for summer concerts, camping and picnic areas, warming shelters, trails that



can be used for sledding and cross-country skiing, and the John Crowley Nature Center and Astronomical Observatory Center.

## TRANQUILITY RIDGE PARK

Corner of Greenwood Lake Turnpike and Beech Road, Hewitt (West Milford), NJ 07421

Tranquility Ridge Park is a 2,062-acre watershed protection area with hiking trails that connect to the adjacent Sterling State Forest and Long Pond Ironworks. The park was created from parts of the original Long Pond Ironworks, which produced iron for



guns, ammunition and other needs during the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Civil War. Among the Park's trails is the historic Hasenclever Iron Trail, which was developed for the operations of the Long Pond Ironworks.

## WEASEL BROOK PARK

794 Park Drive, Clifton, NJ 07013



Weasel Brook Park, named after the brook that runs through it, is a 19-acre park located in the center of urban Clifton. Designed by the famed Olmsted Brothers Firm, the park is the location of a number of events, including concerts, family movies,

and flea markets. The park features restrooms, comfort stations, basketballs courts, exercise circuit and playgrounds. Weasel Brook Park is also home to the newly restored Westervelt-Vanderhoef House, an approximately 300-year-old historic Dutch home. The home was added to the National Register of Historic Places in March 2023.

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## PASSAIC COUNTY COURT HOUSE

73-87 Hamilton Street, Paterson, NJ 07505

The Court House and its surrounding buildings were constructed during the American Renaissance and are deeply rooted in the histories of the City of Paterson and Passaic County. These structures reflect the rich cultural past of the city, county, and state. Like most buildings erected during the time period,



the Passaic County Court House has a European architectural influence, modeling St. Peter's Basilica located within the Vatican City. Construction of the Court House was completed in November 1903. The architect, Samuel Burrage Reed, was one of the most prominent regional architects of the late 19th Century and early 20th Century. The Passaic County Court House still serves its intended purpose, acting as a functioning, public court house providing the highest level of judiciary public service in the County. The Department of Cultural & Historic Affairs oversees rotations of artistic and historic exhibitions in the Court House rotunda, and regularly hosts events to engage the public with the building and its history.

## UNITED STATES CUSTOM HOUSE AND POST OFFICE

63-65 Hamilton Street, Paterson, NJ 07505



The United States Custom House and Post Office (aka the Court House Annex) built 1899, is an excellent example of Flemish renaissance revival style architecture in the United States designed by the master architects for the United States Department of Treasury William Martin Aiken and James Knox Taylor. This

building has remained relatively unaltered on the exterior. The building has a high artistic value with ornate ornamental detailing, including decorative patterned brickwork; limestone carvings and stepped Dutch gables on three elevations.

## **DEY MANSION WASHINGTON'S HEADQUARTERS**

199 Totowa Road, Wayne, NJ 07470



The Dey Mansion, located in Preakness Valley Park, was listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places in 1972. Under the direction of the Passaic County Board of County Commissioners, the staff at the Dey Mansion are dedicated to preserving and interpreting the history of the Dey family and the important role that their home played as General George

Washington's headquarters during the summer and fall of 1780. Through tours, lectures, and special events, the Dey Mansion promotes the exploration of life in Colonial America, the events and people of the American Revolution, and the need and importance of historic preservation.

# THE CLIFTON MUSEUM AT THE JOHN & ANNA VREELAND HOUSE

971 Valley Road, Clifton, NJ 07013

The Clifton Museum is housed in the John and Anna Vreeland House. This site is owned by the City of Clifton. Through a shared services agreement, the museum is operated by the County Department of Cultural & Historic Affairs.



The homestead was originally part of a large area of land purchased from local tribes in 1679 by fourteen Dutch families. This acreage was called the Acquackanonk patent and extended from the Passaic River to Garret Mountain and from the Montclair boundary to the Paterson Falls. Today, the cities of Passaic, Clifton, and Paterson occupy most of this land. The current structure on site was built circa 1815 by John and Anna Vreeland. It was purchased by Henry Hamilton in 1856, remaining in that family until 1972.

The Department of Cultural & Historic Affairs is dedicated to preserving and interpreting the history of the Hamilton-Van Wagoner homestead and the role it played in the City of Clifton's 19th century rural history. Through tours, lectures, and events, the Clifton Museum promotes the exploration of life in 19th century America, the events and people of the 19th century, and the need and importance of historic preservation.

## LAMBERT CASTLE AND LAMBERT TOWER

3 Valley Road, Paterson, NJ 07503



Lambert Castle, referred to as "The Castle" by many local residents, is the late Victorian-era mansion of former silk magnate Catholina Lambert. Built in 1892, Lambert Castle represents one of several rare examples of castellated residential architecture in the US. It was here that Lambert displayed his prized

collection of European and American paintings. Lambert Castle was listed

on the New Jersey Register of Historic Places in 1975 and the National Register of Historic Places in 1976. The site is currently closed for renovations and is set to reopen in 2025-2026.

Situated within Garret Mountain Reservation, the 70-feet tall Lambert Tower was built in 1896. After Lambert's death, the tower was open to visitors throughout the 1930s and was used by the United States' military as a lookout for enemy aircraft during World War II. Today, visitors are able to enjoy spectacular panoramic views from the top of the observation tower.



# PASSAIC COUNTY ARCHEOLOGICAL CENTER AT THE HARRY S. VREELAND HOUSE

1101 Greenwood Lake Turnpike, Ringwood, NJ 07456



The Passaic County Archeological Center at the Harry S. Vreeland House is the only habitable building remaining on the former Vreeland-Rhinesmith Property, now referred to as the Highland Meadows Property. The structure was built between 1905-1908 on the farm of the Vreeland Family. The site originally had eleven structures, comprised of

several homes and many small outbuildings, which supported the farm. Highland Meadows is adjacent to Long Pond Ironworks State Park and has views of the Monksville Reservoir. The site is currently undergoing renovations and will open as the County's archeological center in Fall 2025.

# PASSAIC COUNTY ARTS CENTER AT THE JOHN W. REA HOUSE

675 Goffle Road, Hawthorne, NJ 07506

The Passaic County Arts Center at the John W. Rea House is dedicated to presenting high-quality and accessible arts events and programming to the public. Through gallery exhibitions, workshops, arts classes, and public programs, the Passaic County Arts Center promotes



visual and performing arts. The John W. Rea House (circa 1810) was listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places in 1999. Visitors can view the historic house and different exhibitions, and take part in various educational and public programs.

## SCHUYLER-COLFAX HOUSE

2343 Hamburg Turnpike, Wayne, NJ 07470



The Schuyler Colfax House, located just a few miles from the Van Riper-Hopper site, was the ancestral home of Hester Schuyler. Originally a one story home built in 1694-1695, Hester and her Husband William Colfax expanded the home by adding a second story Georgian style

extension in 1783. In 1973 the Schuyler-Colfax house was added to the State and National Registers of Historic Places.

The last Schuyler-Colfax descendant to occupy the house was Dr. Jane Adelia Colfax (1923-2005), one of the first female doctors in Wayne Township. Dr. Colfax would occupy the home until 1992, when she sold the house to Wayne Township. The County of Passaic acquired the home in July 2023 and is currently planning its restoration. The site is set to reopen Fall 2025 as the Passaic County Military Heritage Museum.

## VANDERHOEF-WESTERVELT HOUSE

794 Park Drive, Clifton, NJ 07013

The Vanderhoef-Westervelt House is located within Weasel Brook Park in Clifton. The house serves as an extension to both the Departments of Cultural & Historic Affairs and Parks & Recreation. They permit the use of the building as a meeting space for various



organizations, as well as house exhibitions on the history of Clifton, Passaic County, and Weasel Brook Park. In addition, the departments host educational and recreational programs throughout the year.

# WASHINGTON-ROCHAMBEAU NATIONAL HERITAGE TRAIL



The Washington-Rochambeau National Historic Trail encompasses and commemorates over 680 miles of land and water trails/routes followed by the allied Continental and French armies between 1780-1783 under their respective leaders, generals Washington and Rochambeau, through Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, and Washington D.C. This march led to the American-French victory over British forces under Lord Cornwallis at the siege of Yorktown, Virginia essentially ending the

War for Independence. The National Historic Trail also includes the allied troops' return march and water routes and related reconnaissance expeditions of the officers. Two sections of this National Historic Trail run through Passaic County; covering the townships of Ringwood, Wanaque, Bloomingdale, Pompton Lakes, and Wayne.

This trail has been designated and marked with signage. The Visitor Center and stopping point for the trail is at Dey Mansion Washington's Headquarters.

#### THE WAYNE MUSEUM

The Wayne Museum is made up of historic sites encompassing the history of Wayne, including the Van Riper-Hopper House and the Meade -Van Duyne House. These sites are owned by the Township of Wayne, but are operated through a shared services agreement with the County of Passaic.

## **VAN RIPER-HOPPER HOUSE**

533 Berdan Avenue, Wayne, NJ 07470



The Van Riper-Hopper House was built by Uriah Van Riper for his bride Maria Berdan in 1786. Located on its original site, the museum represents the agricultural society that dominated present-day Wayne for over 200 years. Today, the farmstead features a historic

herb garden, archaeology laboratory, and community garden that pays homage to its agricultural roots. The Van Riper-Hopper House was listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places in 1972.

### **MEAD-VAN DUYNE HOUSE**

543 Berdan Avenue, Wayne, NJ 07470

The Mead-Van Duyne House was built in the mid-18th century on land acquired by John Mead, a weaver, in 1707. In 1816, the property earned its contemporary name when Giles Mead Jr. sold the house and 160 acre property to his son-in-law, Abraham Van Duyne,



and his daughter, Catherine Mead. In 1973, in anticipation of the expansion of Route 23, the NJ Department of Transportation purchased the property. In 1974, the Wayne Historical Commission led a campaign to save the house and it was moved to the Van Riper-Hopper property.

# **COUNTY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES**
